REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING SEPTEMBER 6, 2022

The regular meeting of the Spring Valley City Council was held in the City Hall Council Chambers, 215 N. Greenwood Street, Spring Valley, Il. 61362 and called to order by Mayor Malooley Thompson at 7:00 p.m. with the following Aldermen answering present to the roll call: Mike Herrmann, Ed Jauch, Chris Affelt, Jen Diaz, Greg Campbell, Deb Baltikauski, Ken Bogacz and Dave Pellegrini. 8 present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

There were no public comments on agenda items.

#14485 Moved by Alderman Pellegrini and seconded by Herrmann that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting and approve them as presented. Aye votes: Herrmann, Jauch, Affelt, Diaz, Campbell, Baltikauski, Bogacz and Pellegrini. 8 ayes. Motion carried.

The list of bills was presented, a copy of which was given to each Alderman 48 hours prior to the meeting.

#14486 Moved by Alderman Baltikauski and seconded by Bogacz that we dispense with the reading of the bills, approve them as presented and warrants be drawn for same. Aye votes: Herrmann, Jauch, Affelt, Diaz, Campbell, Baltikauski, Bogacz and Pellegrini. 8 ayes. Motion carried.

Alderman Bogacz presented a list of sidewalks for the 2022 sidewalk program. He is in the process of getting quotes but noted we have not had much success getting many responses in the past. It was suggested that we award the project to the lowest local bidder. He will have quotes at the next regular council meeting. Alderman Bogacz is also moving forward to create a master list for sidewalk repairs/replacements.

Alderman Baltikauski scheduled a Legislative Committee meeting for September 22, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. to discuss a possible Fire District with Fire Chief Bogatitus and a Legislative Committee meeting for September 28, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. to start working on a Capital Improvement plan for projects we want to do over the next 1-5 years.

Alderman Pellegrini thanked the Street Department for work done at the parks including installing a new swing donated by Upscale Resale at Baltikauski Park and cutting some fruit trees down at the dog park. Pellegrini also reported the Carpenter's Union will be donating a table and bench to the dog park.

Police Chief Curran reported the traffic situation at JFK for drop off and pick up is much better now. He then discussed the DVR system noting it needs to be replaced or completely overhauled as soon as possible. He has been in contact with 2 vendors regarding the system. There was council discussion and the Chief will move forward with the project.

Deputy Chief Kinkin was present and read a letter recognizing Chief Curran for everything he has done for the department since he was appointed Chief.

Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Associates gave an update on the 2022 Street Maintenance project noting a bid opening by September 26th at the latest, he has sent the estimate and project report for the \$150,000 DCEO grant, the west interceptor project is waiting on the grant agreement then we will bid the project and the 4th Street Water Main permit is under review and a bid date may be September 28th.

Superintendent Norton reported Well #10 went down due to electrical issues, Water Well is sending a Tech in the morning and we are now running Well #11. Norton also reported he did some work on the east interceptor today, some spray patching and changed a culvert on Marquette Lane.

Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Associates reported the bid opening for the 2022 Street Maintenance Program is scheduled for September 26, 2022, he distributed a conceptual drawing of a 20-acre park for the OSLAD grant application which he noted is not necessarily the property we will negotiate if we receive the grant. Richetta noted the first step is to apply for an OSLAD grant (50/50 match) to acquire a property for the park and then 2 years down the road the next step would be to apply for the construction.
