All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Chief Curran reported in order to get a new squad car in the next fiscal year he would need to put in an order to build the car now. There were no objections. Chief Curran also noted we will be losing an officer to another Police Department and we have scheduled a meeting of the Board of Fire and Police to discuss and start the police testing process again, his department has received a Lexipol gold status for policy and procedures, he has received the 2022 National Night Out plaque and a National Health and Nutrition Examination survey will be conducted in Bureau County (including Spring Valley) between February 18, 2023 through May 5, 2023. Chief Curran has a list of interviewers who will be working the neighborhoods in the county.

Mike Richetta reported they would like to get the 4th Street Watermain scheduled as we need to notify the residents, schools and police and the STU project has a bid date in June and he will have an engineering agreement for approval at an upcoming meeting.

Superintendent Norton reported issues at Sunset Farms continue, they have televised and have made a make shift catch basin which they are monitoring.

Mayor Malooley Thompson reported she has been communicating with Attorney Barry regarding the City owned building downtown, we are waiting for a judge to be appointed and will follow up tomorrow.

Eric Carls from Carl's Engineering gave an update on the rental inspection program noting they have inspected about 300 rentals after this week. Carls hopes to have all initial inspections done by the end of June. So far only 3 rentals have passed but many (approx. 60-70%) have minor violations that are easily fixable. He then discussed the GovPilot program which he is not using because it is not functioning the way we had intended it to and it takes 3 times as long to complete an inspection.

Alderman Pellegrini reported Park Board meetings will begin again next month (second Tuesday of each month), the board needs 2 new members, Dave Baracani is the new Park Board President and in order to keep our current park maintenance employee he is asking the council to increase the hourly rate to \$21. this season.

Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Assoc. reported there is no start date for the 4th Street watermain project but he is hopeful it will begin in March. He will be watching the traffic in the area for the next few weeks and will work with the schools and police department. Richetta also noted surface water issues at the library last fall and he will work with the Library Council Representative Alderman Baltikauski to make sure the issue is resolved.
