REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING JUNE 5, 2023

The regular meeting of the Spring Valley City Council was held in the City Hall Council Chambers, 215 N. Greenwood Street, Spring Valley, Il. 61362 and called to order by Mayor Malooley Thompson at 7:00 p.m. with the following Aldermen answering present to the roll call: Mike Herrmann, CJ VanSchaick, Chris Affelt, Jeff Chiaventone, Greg Campbell, Deb Baltikauski, Ken Bogacz and Dave Pellegrini. 8 present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

There were no public comments on agenda items.

#14659 Moved by Alderman VanSchaick and seconded by Herrmann that we dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting and approve them as presented. Aye votes: Herrmann, VanSchaick, Affelt, Chiaventone, Campbell, Baltikauski, Bogacz and Pellegrini. 8 ayes. Motion carried.

The following list of bills was presented, a copy of which was given to each Alderman 48 hours prior to the meeting.

#14660 Moved by Alderman Pellegrini and seconded by Chiaventone that we dispense with the reading of the bills, approve them as presented and warrants be drawn for same. Aye votes: Herrmann, VanSchaick, Affelt, Chiaventone, Campbell, Baltikauski, Bogacz and Pellegrini. 8 ayes. Motion carried.

Mayor Malooley Thompson congratulated the St. Bede Girls Softball Team who won the State Championship, announced fireworks display will be on July 1, 2023 at dusk, we are in the final stages for a \$595,000. water line replacement grant, she is working with Eric Carls on the residential registry program (Attorney Barry noted initial inspections are almost complete and those left are property owners that are not cooperating and he will be sending out letters), she is working with Andrew Ebener to get the Judication program up and running, has had communication with Mr. Hermes at JFK regarding land available for possible baseball and softball fields (Alderman Pellegrini noted we currently do not own a girls softball field so the young teams are playing everywhere but here), Mayor Thompson reported we previously applied for an OSLAD grant to acquire property for the fields but were not chosen but we can apply again and she will continue to work on it, she had communication regarding the hospital and was optimistic last week but unfortunately Carle Clinic is a no at this time, met with 10/33 Ambulance last week who were asked to pull out of St. Margaret's but are with a system at OSF Ottawa and she is confident they will be selected as a provider, and then announced a reminder of upcoming events – Summer Fest June 10th, SV Historical Association Car Show June 11th and the next Friday Night Market June 16th.

Alderman Baltikauski scheduled a Legislative committee meeting for June 15, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. to discuss and finalize the proposed Vendor/Food Truck Ordinance which she has broken into 2 ordinances, commercial updates to our code and any other matters that may come before the committee.

Alderman Herrmann scheduled a Finance meeting following Legislative on June 15th to discuss a proposed budget and any other matters that may come before the committee.

Alderman Bogacz distributed an alley evaluation rated by ward. He will be working with Chamlin to prepare a map with the alleys. Alderman Bogacz noted there is no need to blacktop at this time and we will be repairing the alleys and will begin to concrete approaches. He will have a suggested list at the next meeting of those to start first.

Mayor Malooley Thompson introduced Darryl Stuggis who discussed and explained Juneteenth and asked to use Kirby Park for a Celebrate Juneteenth event on June 19th. Mr. Stuggis wants to bring something to our community for our kids and hopes the event continues to grow.

Attorney Colin Barry discussed communication received from Lauterbach and Amen, LLP suggesting the City review our Expected Rate of Return on Investments assumptions annually for the Police Pension Fund. There was discussion regarding the current assumed rate of return and the council felt the rate is reasonable.

#14663 Moved by Alderman Herrmann and seconded by Bogacz that we continue with the current Rate of Return on Investment Assumptions for our GASB 67/68 Actuarial Reports. Aye votes: Herrmann, VanSchaick, Affelt, Campbell, Chiaventone, Baltikauski, Bogacz and Pellegrini. 8 ayes. Motion carried.

The council discussed our Burning Policy noting we have garbage service and leaf collection so there isn't a reason to burn. The code will be reviewed and discussed further at the next Legislative committee meeting.

Mike Richetta from Chamlin and Associates recommended awarding the work to Advanced Asphalt Co. in the amount of \$20,868. which is the low quote and they are under the \$25,000. threshold for bidding and meet the Responsible Bidder Ordinance.

Mayor Malooley Thompson introduced new owners of the Locker Room and she is excited that they have kept the business in town.

The council asked Attorney Barry to let him know we are keeping the original amount agreed on.

Alderman Baltikauski asked the Attorney to notify Mr. Kisch that he needs to fix the road at 900 W First St. as agreed upon.

Superintendent Norton asked what the intensions are for the 2 lots that the city owns as he is now cutting the grass. Attorney Barry will look into the process to try to sell the lots.

Spring Valley resident Steve Pyle was present to discuss a recent sink hole at his property. He has repaired the problem and would like the city to share some of the cost as some of it was in the city right-of-way. Richetta felt this was a reasonable request and will work with Mr. Pyle to determine the city share of the cost.
